






Why a rural foodbank?



Rural Poverty?

- Cost of living for family of 4 up to £10k higher than urban
- Fuel Poverty at 28% vs. 18% in urban
- Travel costs more than double for low earners
- Rural inflation 7.7% in 2011 (UK avg of 4.7%)



The foodbank takes the client details and fills in a voucher





If needed two members of the delivery team, take an **Emergency** Foodbox round to the client




Since we opened in May 2013 we've fed


